Ground Breaking of the New School Building

A little rain and wind couldn't keep the shovels idle Jan. 11 during the groundbreaking ceremony for Grandview Heights Schools' facilities project.
Several groups -- including students, teachers and principals; school and community leaders; representatives from compa-

nies involved in the upcoming project; and residents -- had the chance to scoop up a pile of ceremonial dirt during the event, held in the Grandview Heights HIgh School gymnasium.

The real movement of dirt began around Jan. 27, when the first phase of the project -- construc-

tion of a new grade 4-8 building began. Fencing went up at that time and the Fairview Avenue turnaround was closed as will the parking lot off Oakland Avenue and west of the Grandview Heights High School gym. The route middle school students take to the high school will be reoriented; they'll have to cross Oakland and walk on the sidewalk opposite the school before using the crosswalk to access the high school building, Culp said. Middle-school students walk down Oakland to the high school for music, foreign language and some math classes, he said. The new 4-8 building will be constructed in the space between the current Edison Intermediate/ Larson Middle School and the high school. Students will continue to attend classes at Edison/ Larson through the construction of the new school, which is expected to be complete by summer 2021.



What Do Bobcats and Crickets Have in Common?

Proud '74 GHHS grad John Lorenz is also known as the Cricket Man for the Columbus and Franklin County Metro Parks. He raises 3,000 crickets every week and donates them to Metro Parks to feed animals in the living stream at the park's nature center. Kids love to take part in the feeding frenzy and watch as fish, frogs and turtles compete for their meal.

John has volunteered with Metro Parks since 1989 and has a special interest in water and stream quality. His wife Karen is also a Metro Parks volunteer. John's interest in the outdoors began in Grandview, as all great stories do, back with his Boy Scouts Troop 10 at First Community Church, where he was inspired by nature and earned nature-related merit badges.

John went on to earn a bachelor's degree in Environmental Interpretation from OSU School of Natural Resources in 1978. Much like a tree, his professional career has strong roots and different branches.

During summer before John's junior year of college, his brother Mike needed part-time help in his electronic organ repair business. The following year, Mike moved to Cincinnati and left the business to John, who continued to work on it part time while completing college. Upon graduation, John went into the organ repair business full time for six years. Organ repair requires not only knowledge of electronics, but also mechanical intuition. Organs also became computerized during that time and a new career for John was born.

He earned his Novell certification and worked for several networking companies before becoming the one-man IT department for a Columbusbased manufacturing company. This gave him weekends free to volunteer at Big Darby Creek.

As John says, "Volunteering is a way for me to use my college education. Metro Parks provides me with a place I can do this. I could not own, let alone maintain, the land that Metro Park provides to me for free."



John started volunteering at Metro Parks in 1989 where he helped park visitors and even Boy Scout troops learn more about stream study. He also volunteered with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources.

Grandview is never far away from his soul. Each Fall, Grandview second-grade students take a trip to Darby Creek and John is a regular educator that day. The kids catch insects and work with John to determine what was caught and learn the life histories of the insects.

John's "Nirvana moment" came in 2012, when the Big Darby Nature Center opened. The main attraction is a 54-foot-long raised stream with seven different water levels and stocked with animals from Big Darby Creek. Those animals needed to

be fed. What is almost every animal's favorite food? Crickets. John perfected his cricket production skills and now produces 3,000 crickets

a week. He donates these to the Ohio Wildlife Center, Big Darby Creek and Stratford Ecological Center, who uses them to hand feed chickens.

A nature lover through and through, John's other volunteer activities include vernal pools programs, winter hike series, seed harvesting, invasive shrub removal and resource management for parks throughout central Ohio. It's no surprise that John was named both Battelle Darby Creek Park Volunteer of the Year and Metro Parks Overall Volunteer of the Year at the annual recognition program, held in January 2020. Congratulations and thank you, John!

Alumni Q&A: Art in Grandview



Curt Sneary '82

Q: When did you know that you had artistic talent?

Curt: My junior or senior year at GHHS. Art teacher Lee Eckleberry noticed my talent and offered me a scholarship to the Columbus College of Art and Design (CCAD). My first experience with getting hooked on painting was with one of my first large acrylic paintings in Doc Eckleberry's class; it was of a waterfall. I remember mixing a tiny bit of black paint with another color and becoming amazed at how powerful the black paint was (a little going a long way). It's strange to think that such a small thing would pull you in.

Q: Have you stayed in touch with Lee Eckleberry?

Curt: Yes. We connected via Facebook this past summer and had some long conversations on the phone. It was important for me to let him know how grateful I was to him. We are in the process of trading paintings. I believe my interest in landscape and portraiture paintings may have been from his influence. He is a true genius, I am blessed to have been under his "mentor wing" and to still have his support to this day.

Q: Did you end up going to CCAD?

Curt: Yes, I graduated with a BFA in Advertising Design. I always dreamed of being like Darren on Bewitched and work in advertising agencies and come up with campaigns. I ended up less like Darren and more like Van Gogh. I worked in some agencies in Columbus and Atlanta and realized this wasn't what I wanted to do the rest of my life. Like Van Gogh, I don't deal with stress well. I haven't cut off my ear yet, but have come close.

Q: What is a typical day like in Curt Sneary's world?

Curt: If I wake up not screaming from a nightmare then I'm off to a good start. I paint in my studio in the very early morning and then walk my dog. I like home improvements so am always tinkering around the house. I recently bought a foreclosure in

Allentown, Penn., to be closer to NYC for my art and for an investment. I spend part of my day marketing my art and messing about on social media. I play a little guitar and read then wind down with a movie.

Q: How long does one of your paintings take?

Curt: A lifetime! Joking, but true in the sense that all of a person's knowledge goes into their current creation/project. The amount of time depends on what kind of painting. I can do an abstract in a few hours and a large movie painting can take up to a month.

Q: Your movie paintings have words in them, can you elaborate?

Curt: The words are as important as the image. I use words verbatim from a movie to pay homage to the writer. My movie paintings are very personal, sometimes I will remember a scene from a movie just from the words. This genre of painting (Neo-Pop) still speaks a thousand words because the words in the painting can be

interpreted in many different ways.

Q: You mentioned you wanted to be close to NYC for your art. How is that going?

Curt: Slow. My house took more time than I anticipated to just get up-and-running. I have made some inquiries that haven't come to fruition yet; I have a mountain of work ahead of me. An artist can't/shouldn't just walk into a gallery and ask to be represented; it takes time to understand the market and the "art scene.'

Q: Have you been in art galleries before?

Curt: Yes, in Atlanta and Florida. I started taking painting more seriously late in life and very serious just recently. In NYC's eye, I am an "emerging artist."

Q: What advice would you give to a person wanting to be an artist?

Curt: Don't do it for the money or glamour. There is little money and no glamour. Accolades are nice; but, you can receive accolades in any occupation. I would tell them to be in the mindset to do it for the world, for other people. I have found that this is the best path for your inner-self. If you are spiritual, then use your gift to please the heavens.

Q: If one would like to inquire about your art how would they contact you?

Curt: My website would be a good start. www.curtsnearyart.com. I would like to thank everyone who has supported the arts in their lifetime.

Connie J. Clark Mann '67

A starter on the varsity field hockey and basketball teams for three years, Connie played center forward for field hockey and was responsible for many goals. As a "roving" forward for the Bobcat basketball team, she served as point guard and shooter. She was a 750-point letter winner in the Girls' Athletic Association, served as vice president her senior year and also received a Girls' Athletic Association scholarship.

Connie attended Bowling Green State University, where she started on both the intercollegiate field hockey and basketball teams. She was the point guard for BGSU's basketball team during the first-ever Ohio Intercollegiate Women's Basketball tournament in 1971. Delta Psi Kappa also recognized her for outstanding contributions to health physical education and the recreation department at BGSU.

Connie earned a master's degree from Miami University in Guidance and Counseling and served 27 years as a counselor and teacher in elementary through college levels. During that tenure, she also coached swimming, tennis (three undefeated seasons), volleyball (Michigan state championship game), basketball, and track (individual state qualifiers). Post-college, Connie started playing competitive tennis in 1986. She and her teammates won the USTA Women's doubles regional tennis tournament in 1989. Connie's Grandview family includes sisters Shelley (1970) and Carol (1979), as well as nephews Phil (1998) and Todd (2000) Lovegrove, who are both also members of the GHHS Sports Hall of Fame.



Katie Speakman '99

Katie was a three-sport GHHS athlete in softball, soccer, and basketball, earning 11 varsity letters. As a four-year letter winner and two-time captain at first base for the Bobcat softball team, Katie was named second-team All Buckeye Athletic conference (BAC) as a freshman, and first-team her sophomore, junior, and senior years. Katie was named second-team All-District her sophomore year, and first-team All-District her junior and senior years. She was a three-time MVP, and as a junior, became the first GHHS player to earn an All-State honor (2nd team) in softball. In 1999, Katie was an integral part of the first BAC championship team in school history. As a Bobcat soccer team member, Katie was a four-year letter winner and team captain her senior year. She was named first-team All-Independent League her junior and senior years. She was named Offensive MVP her junior year, and was part of the 1998 league championship team.

As a guard for the basketball Bobcats, Katie was a three-year letter winner and senior captain. Named second-team All-BAC her senior year, Katie was a part of the 1998 and 1999 BAC championship teams.

After high school, she graduated from Denison University with a bachelor's degree in Spanish and played for the Denison Big Red softball team, earning three conference championships and qualifying for the NCAA tournament three consecutive years.

Katie is the daughter of Mike and Vicki Speakman (both '71) and brother Travis is a 2001 GHHS graduate.



Grandview during WWll

Most young men who attended Grandview Heights High School during the "War Years" expected to eventually serve in the military. More than 500 names of Grandview military servicemen were posted on the outdoor "honor roll" erected in a park adjacent to the public library. Homes of servicemen were marked by placards in the window with Blue Stars for servicemen and Gold Stars for deceased servicemen. There was very strong Grandview community pride for "our boys" in uniform.

As the war progressed, we learned the names of servicemen as the sons, brothers and sweethearts of our neighbors and schoolmates. When a student was called to the principal's office, they might learn of a military casualty. It sent a chill throughout the school. Pat Short '42, president of his

graduating class and a good football and basketball player, was killed in action in late 1944. Jean Lindsay, brother of (Rook) Bobby Lindsey and Helen Lindsey Bonney, was killed in March 1945. Many fellow Rooks from the 1942-45 years served in the military and saw action.

Frank "Dude" Higgs '26, an early Rook, came to a special school assembly in 1944. "Dude" went to China to train pilots early in the war. He was the inspiration for Milton Caniff's popular "Steve Canyon" cartoon strip. Dude Hennick was our "Dude" Higgs. During the assembly, we were treated to a fascinating talk about his military adventures. Tragically, "Dude" was killed in 1945 while piloting an aircraft in the China Theater.

Sometimes, aircraft piloted by GHHS alums "buzzed" the high school. We would hear the approaching aircraft and look to see an aircraft skimming the football field and headed straight for school. The sweetheart of one of the military pilots lived on the street next to mine. She'd sometimes get a "notice" from her boyfriend in the form of a small wrench tied

to a silk scarf thrown from the plane. By buzzing the neighborhood, all of the residents knew what was happening and would watch. I never heard a word of criticism regarding these antics. There was a special regard towards our military and those young men were always treated as heroes.

When I entered the Navy, three GHHS classmates and six pals from Arlington stayed together through boot camp. I enlisted in April 1945, following the deaths of President Franklin Roosevelt and war correspondent Ernie Pyle. The shock of their deaths persuaded my father to sign his approval because I had not reached my 18th birthday. Within three months of leaving Grandview, the Pacific War was over. It was our good fortune that we weren't killed or injured in action.

nurturing and, God knows, our teachers were as good as they come. Police Chief Bob Livingston dispatched problems quickly and most problems never made for big news. As a juvenile, I had a nose for mischief. One year, Chief Livingston dropped by our home and suggested to

my mom I "ride along" with him for the next few evenings. During one ridealong, he arrested an intoxicated man and took him to the basement jail. The man started raising a ruckus, slapping his metal drinking cup along the cell bars. When we went downstairs to investigate, the man had torn his cup handle loose, broke the ceiling light bulb, used the cup handle to short the electricity and then fell asleep. As a result, this 14-year-old son never caused another moment of worry for Chief Livingston (or my mom). Chief Livingston is one of those people who not only made it safe to live in Grandview; he was a friend to many young men who were disposed to mischief.

Everybody seems to have a favorite high school teacher in those days. Dorcus Truckmiller was our English and Speech teacher and drama coach for school plays. One early morning, I found it necessary to empty Miss Truckmiller's wooden trash barrel from her home as I needed the barrel staves for a Rook meeting. Very old Rooks will recall that it was the duty of each Skunk pledge to gather barrel staves from which to fashion paddles for the "active" Rooks to whomp Skunks. Miss Truckmiller spotted me and told Principal Blauser what I had done. I was called to his office later that morning. Miss Truck-

miller, Principal Blauser and I made a solemn pact that morning, which I now reveal as one of the best lessons that I've ever learned in life. Mr. Blauser asked me to tell Miss Truckmiller the truth about what I'd done. I told the truth and Miss Truckmiller's stern look turned into a lovely smile. I walked out of that office with justice being handled very gently. I was a "free man" but it did leave a positive mark on me. News of my transgression did, however, reach the Rooks and I got several whacks with Miss Truckmiller's wooden staves at the next meeting, so fair justice was finally dispatched.

Miss Truckmiller and all our teachers marked Grandview as different from other schools. The community itself was a solid middle class area. There were large church memberships throughout. When our class held its last reunion, the current GHHS principal addressed us and commented how the community continued to draw families who wanted their children to attend Grandview. That's so comforting to an old alum. I would still be happy to call Grandview home.

Why does the Brotherhood of Rooks continue to have substance for old guys like me? It's not about membership exclusivity. There was, of course, our unique ownership of that fraternity house. We had some great after-game dances. We formed a tight little community within our tight little Grandview community. For me, the Brotherhood of Rooks was a beacon for things I aspired to. It made me want to be a better person.
