



She was an excellent student and earned an academic scholarship to Denison University, where she also worked as a waitress in the school dining hall to help with expenses. transferred to Ohio State with a business major.

At OSU, her lively personality, coupled with her looks, won her the coveted title as the "Sweetheart of Sigma Chi." This sounds quaint today, but it was a very big honor at Ohio State in 1950. Upon graduation, she went to work as a fashion coordinator with a large Dayton department store.

On a whim at age 23, Pat and two friends decided to go to Paris to see if they could find work there. Pat soon became one of the leading fashion models in Paris. Her face and figure became widely known in the European fashion business, showing for top designers like Givenchy, Dior and Fath, and appearing on covers and stories in the best fashion magazines. It was a glamorous, but hectic, lifestyle. So, in search of a more sedate life, Pat returned to New York to model for Anne Klein at Junior Sophisticates. In 1956, she met and married Andy Brown, an advertising executive. That marriage lasted 61 happy years. Andy's advertising job moved them from New York to Portland, Ore., and San Francisco and they were blessed with two daughters. Pat continued to model on a part-time basis while bringing

up the girls. Her busy, creative mind was working on an idea for a new type of business - a personal counseling service for homeowners being relocated to the Bay Area. Pat and Andy established "Relocation Consultants." One office grew into several West Coast offices. Pat's college business management studies paid off handsomely and the couple worked as partners for 15 years. The business ultimately produced the financial resources to establish several scholarships. Their philosophy was that education is the best possible contribution because it has such an ongoing effect and they felt an obligation to support the schools that gave them the education so critical to their success.

They sold the business in 1980 and retired to travel and spend time with their family. Pat once wrote "I've been very lucky. I feel that I have it all - a loving husband, two happily married daughters, four beautiful, healthy grandchildren and the financial security to enjoy it all." Pat passed in 2017 at age 88.

New World Champion

Covid-19 forced the best beer milers in the world to compete virtually in 2020, but the virtual format did not stop Allison Grace Morgan '01 from breaking the world record by running 6:16.5.

A beer mile is a 1-mile drinking race combining running and speed drinking. Typically, the race takes place on a standard 400-metre or 1/4-mile running track. The race begins at the 1-mile starting line with the consumption of a 12-ounce beer, followed by a full lap around the track. During the race, competitors drink four beers and run four laps around the quartermile track.

Morgan got the pending world record by being amazingly consistent and super fast on her chugs. All the competitors had a week to go out and run their best beer miles, film them, and submit them for verification. On July 4, the filmed races were unveiled as simultaneous virtual races on LetsRun.com.


Karissa Brown

This 1922 photograph shows the Grandview High School under construction and resembles the construction activity currently taking place. This view is looking north from the rear of the high school, showing buildings lining Fifth Avenue in the far distance and cars parked along Third Avenue to the left of the shed on the right. Workmen are building the foundation and a large stack of drain tile is in the foreground. The photograph is labeled "Grand View High School, L. L. Leveque Co. Contrs." The original high school had twenty-two rooms, could accommodate 600 students, and cost \$290,000.

Study Hall or Social Hall and Library?



Found in the 1949 Highlander yearbook.

The study hall was a large room on the second floor at the front part of the GHHS building. Students from any grade were assigned periods to be there depending upon their schedules and were monitored by a teacher. Study Hall was a great place to socialize before and after school and during the lunch period. At some point, not sure when, the hall was converted into four smaller classrooms. The Study Hall was the original location of the Grandview Heights Library.

On Jan. 11, 1923, the Grandview Heights Board of Education approved a plan to establish a public library and, in June 1924, the Grandview Heights Public Library opened its doors in a room in the Grandview Heights High School. After moving to four different rented sites on First Avenue, the library moved to the present location, 1685 West First Avenue, in September 1936. The building was built with WPA funds on land donated by George Cambridge Urlin, one of the founding fathers of Grandview Heights. In addition to the high school branch, various branches were added over the years, including Robert Louis Stevenson Elementary School in 1926; an Upper Arlington branch at Miller Park in 1942; and the Tremont Library in the 1950s. In the 1970s, the Upper Arlington Public Library became an independent system, which included the Miller Park branch and the Tremont Library. The current library is all within one location and does not include any branch locations. It is a founding member and Administering Library of the Central Library Consortium (CLC), a sharing of resources & expenses among 17 Central Ohio library systems cofounded by GHPL in 1988.


