Boyhood, 1901-1918

My friend considered chicken in any form a delicious treat. To me, it's just the opposite. I have to force myself to eat it. I especially dislike the fried variety, though I can tolerate it off-the-bone if the taste is disguised as it is in Chicken a la King, for example. There is a reason for my aversion. The sense of smell affects taste. I can smell chicken and that's it, brother! Back goes my olfactory memory to those days as a boy when I had the chicken house cleaning chore and often chickens to kill. I'm glad I was never exposed to cattle or pigs or I'd have become a vegetarian.

When I was about 10 years old, my dear dad got the idea we ought to raise chickens. We had the space and it was remodeled with nests and "dropping boards" for the feathered food

producers. For suburbanites, dad and mother went in for poultry in a big way. In short order, we acquired an incubator and a brooder, followed soon by a Rhode Island Red rooster, that cost \$25, and a variety of laying hens

It wasn't long before chicken-raising became my mother's hobby. Dad became a silent, non-working partner except he always enthusiastically ate the product. Setting hens were set. The incubator was loaded with fertile eggs. Oats were sprouted for green chicken food out of season. The result each year was healthy, meaty chickens. Some turned out to be hens kept for laying, but there was always an abundance of young roosters which had to be fed or eaten. And eat them


we did, as often as possible as seemed appropriate for Sunday or company dinner. There was always chicken at picnics too. Due largely to the intelligent care of my mother, the eggs and chickens were in abundance when winter weather made fresh eggs scarce at the stores and young fryers were in demand.

The Rhode Island Red proved to be an ideal layer and meat chicken. The \$25 rooster was a good buy, judging by the progeny. The clean hen houses, the attention to feed and water

and poultry medicine paid off in eggs and chickens. So much so, there were chickens in the spring to sell and eggs too. It was World War I time. Fresh eggs and young chickens were expensive at the stores and so friends and neighbors almost stood in line to buy what Mother would sell. I remember she sold eggs, brown eggs they were, too, for as much as \$1 a dozen.

I have to laugh at the logic involved in Dad and Mother's agreement. Dad bought the feed. Mother sold some eggs and "eating chickens". Mother pocketed the revenue apparently with Dad's consent. Mom reasoned no doubt that she did the work and deserved the proceeds. Incidentally, it was the "egg money" that bought the eggshell Haviland china and classical phonograph records she prized. So I guess Dad felt he had a good thing going with plenty of chicken to eat and eggs too, with Mom doing the work and happily acquiring some things she wanted.

Maybe it's the Christmas season, but often my thoughts go back to my pleasant experiences when I was a boy. I just thought of the honeysuckle vines across our long, 40-foot front porch. They were on trellises extending from the floor to the eaves and shaded the porch from the hot afternoon sun. The sweet aroma of the blossoms I can smell yet, most pleasant and "homey". There were one or two drawbacks to those vines. The bees buzzed while gathering honey - thousands of them. While I never got stung I was always worrying that I soon would. Also, when it was time to paint the house, the heavily-veined trellises had to be let down. Eventually, the honeysuckle along with its aroma and shade was replaced



with "snowball" bushes, hydrangeas, huge bushes not attractive to bees.

Speaking of pleasant, "homey" odors, so many of them naturally came from the kitchen. Mom had her canning seasons, peaches, cherries and apples; jams and jellies, too and the pungent, spices of catsup cooking. Every day, especially when mother was baking, the odor was inviting and hunger-inspiring. There was one kitchen odor, however, I hated. The smell of codfish cooking always smelled to me like an unclean toilet. Since it was a favorite dish of Dad's, we had it with some regularity and I had to eat it. The funny thing was, over time I got so I actually liked it. Creamed-cod over boiled potatoes I will remember along with the good-smelling food on which I grew fat and healthy. Bradley Skeele '18

Grandview Memories - A Day in a Life

It is 7:15 a.m. and the first day of summer vacation. Should I have soggy cereal or take a dime to Amicon's for two fresh donuts? I grab my dime, my mitt, baseball and pocket knife and I am off! I am always first to the playground, eating my donuts and practicing playing baseball with my knife (big blade out - little blade at 90 degrees - flip from handle - fall over is an out small & handle land is a single - small & large a double - small only is a triple - large only is a homer) as I wait for my friends.

When the first one arrives, we play a friendly game of "Stretch" where we face each other and you throw your knife at your buddy's feet. If it sticks in the ground, he needs to stretch his foot to the knife. Now, it's his turn and this repeats until one of us falls. Soon, friends #3 and #4 arrive so we can play a knife baseball tourney. Many picnic tables were abused during those summers.

As the rest of the guys arrive, it's time to choose up sides and play left handed from second base to the fence. You only need a pitcher, first baseman, center and right fielder. Anything to the left side is an out. The playground is opening up for the

little kids and that means one thing – the pool is open. Time to run or bike home, put on your suit and head to the pool to swim, hang out, play Minnow & Bass in the deep end and watch the big guys play corner tag (knowing your day will come). If you were "rich" and had 25 cents, you grab the best water soaked hotdog in the world and a pop and five pieces of vanilla taffy. You turn around and it is 2:00 p.m.. Time to head home to get ready to deliver your papers. I started delivering the Citizen that had their station in front of St Christopher's Church. A naïve me, with my Citizen paper bags, rode by the Dispatch station at Third & Hollywood to pick up a friend. I was quite unaware of the rivalry. My greeting was to be pulled off my bike, taken around to the side, tied to a tree with straw put around my feet. Then, one of the bigger boys got his matches out. About that time, the Station Manager (Kelly or Clarence) came out and said these profound words. "They weren't really going to start a fire but, kid, are you stupid? Dispatch kids don't like Citizen kids, so don't come by here anymore. Do you understand?" My reply was "Yes sir! Do you have any Dispatch routes open?" So, I started carrying the Dispatch.

You would pick up your papers, count them to make sure you had enough, fold them, put them in your saddle bags, ride to your route and throw them on (or close to) the porch. Great memories!

It was so great to grow up in Grandview. I challenge everybody to write down their memories and mail them to GHHSAA@ hotmail.com

But it is time to go home, eat a bologna with mustard on white bread with Vitamin D milk for energy to play baseball at 6:00 p.m. Arriving early at 4:30, I would start swinging a bat and throwing with the next kid to arrive. The games were seven innings with no "Mercy" rule. I was on the losing end more often than the winning end. Friends who weren't playing and girls would be watching

and cheering. At the end, everybody shook hands and then somebody would say "Let's go the pool!"

I would run home, take a shower (Dad's idea, not mine) with my trunks on, run down through the "dreaded" woods from Palmer to the pool and swim and go off the high dive until 9:00 p.m. when the pool closed. Run back through the woods at a breakneck speed to home. I memorized where every root and hole was along the way. Mom would ask what did I do today and the reply was "nothing much." As I'd fall asleep, I'd think about tomorrow and say "tomorrow plans - NOTHING MUCH!'
