

When I dove, the pool itself finally growled "Enough" and raised up to punish me. I hit bottom and slid forward across the cement. I pulled myself up the ladder to reveal my skinless pink belly that looked like a grape that'd been dragged along rough sandpaper and then dipped in red ink. Yep, that was enough. Teri and Dave took a few more turns but the summer had come to an end. (Editorial note - do not attempt this. Ever!)

This sweet story begins with two Brotherhood of Rooks fraternity brothers. Camden "Cam" Swart and Charles "Chuck" Whipple started their senior year in the fall of 1941. They each pursued one of two lovely gals who also happened to be friends.Lois "Lu" Herring Swart and Alice "Al" Bland Whipple met when they both attended Stevenson Elementary and stayed friends even after Alice moved to another high school in 10th grade.

After catching a glimpse of Alice, Chuck knew she was the gal for him! He set his sights and never wavered. Cam and Lois would follow suit and connect a few years later. These young men didn't realize, upon graduation, what the next several years would bring.

World War II came along and both men served in the US Army. Chuck continued his relationship with Alice as best he could during the war. 

Vietnam vets so we went to the Wall. It was bittersweet as we remembered all the buddies we served with while mourning the ones left behind. Each veteran received an Honor Flight pin. Dallas's daughter Katherine '08 works in DC, so she was invited to join him and give him his pin. Some groups went to the Lincoln Memorial, some to the Korean Memorial. After seeing the sights on the Mall, we visited The Women's War Memorial for dinner and departed to the airport for the flight home.

On the flight, we had our first mail call since being in the service. It was quite enjoyable! We arrived at Port Columbus at 9:30 p.m. and had such a warm welcome home! We were greeted by cheers from more than 2,000 people and a band.

We'd been gone 16 hours total but the healing this adventure provided is immeasurable. We felt the camaraderie with our fellow veterans that we hadn't experienced since our days in the service.
