## Appendix 8.3: FENCES AND HEDGES

CCR: No. 8, Landscape, Hedges and Fences:
NO fences or hedges shall be erected, placed or permitted to remain on any lot unless approved by the architectural control committee (ACC). Fences and hedges in front yards shall not exceed three feet (3) feet in height or six (6) feet in height on side or back yards. Fences shall be constructed of suitable materials and shall not detract from the appearance of the adjacent property.

In general, the ACC will approve most fences if the fence is considered neighbor friendly. A fence is neighbor friendly if the side facing out is the same or better than the side facing the property where the fence is constructed. The ACC shall determine which side of a fence is the best side. Any fence installed prior to the restated declaration (July 2, 2008) shall be grandfathered and permitted, but must be made compliant when the fence is repaired or replaced..


This example illustrates an acceptable fence if both sides are the same.


Not considered neighbor friendly because the less attractive side is facing the street or neighbors property.

This example illustrates an acceptable metal fence since both sides are equal. If used in the front yard facing the street it should not be more than three feet to be an approved fence.
