

A message from **Stanton Lore**



Dear Stanton,

On June 26, 2015, the Supreme Court held in Obergefell v. Hodges that the Fourteenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution requires a state to license a marriage between two people of the same sex and to recognize a marriage between two people of the same sex when their marriage was lawfully licensed and performed out-of-state.

Accordingly, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) now recognizes all same-sex marriages without regard to a veteran's state of residence. However, 38 U.S.C. 101(3) and § 101(31) define "surviving spouse" and "spouse" as persons "of the opposite sex." These definitions were not specifically addressed in the Supreme Court's decision or by a subsequent statute.

The Veterans Marriage Recognition Act would amend the existing statutes and define a spouse as "who was lawfully married to a veteran, including a marriage between two persons of the same sex." This bill would also remove the requirement "of the opposite sex."

DAV supports S. 4308—the Veterans Marriage Recognition Act of 2022, which would codify the VA's current practice of recognizing same-sex marriages into law. This would provide protection of same-sex marriages within the VA and not allow a change based on policy.

Please contact your Senators and urge their support for this important protection. Thank you for your support of America's disabled veterans and their families.



My technological problems are proliferating again. One issue is my Samsung Galaxy Buds Live (that is, earbuds), which I purchased February 8, 2021, for \$129.99 (before tax) from

Amazon along with 3 lbs. of Anna and Sarah's Dried Pitted Prunes (\$17.99.) The Pitted Prunes are long gone. The earbuds have been used once.

This is all Carol Symkiewicz's fault, by the way. On one of our Class of 64 Zoom calls, she exulted over them and practically forced me into buying them, swearing that I would love them. When they arrived, I called her to ask what to do with them, and soon I was swearing. After two hours trying to explain pairing to me, Carol deserted me. Pairing is introducing your earbuds to the phone or computer and vice versa. So last week, after a year and a half praying for the courage to try again, I asked my helper to figure them out.

My helper, Cecelia, is a woman I hired when I dislocated my hip last year and then for the knee surgery two months later, and somehow she is still here. She is, I hope, the last of a long chain of helpers since my husband died who are aiding me in the Incredible Shrinking Junkyard. The goal has been to reduce 1336 sq. ft of stuff from condo & garage & storage cabinet (a mere closet) into a smaller condo of 842 sq. ft. plus storage cabinet. After 3 years working on the chain gang it still looks like 950 sq. ft of stuff, but we are getting to my books, papers & memorabilia. I have a feeling none of this stuff is not going away, but will at least get sorted. And we are mining the Mother Lode: unused tech gadgets such as the ear buds, Fitbit, and computer peripherals for my laptop.

Additionally, Cecelia is my "fashionista", because she organizes my clothes into "outfits," is trying to help me with makeup, and is my personal trainers, supervising my rehabilitation from the dislocation and knee replacement. She also helps me with tech.

Carol, it turns out that I have a problem with left and right, and up and down, at least in relation to earbuds. I'm also get very distracted by the beauty of the Mystic Bronze

charging case, but more by the fact the earbuds look like unshelled peanuts. I start salivating.

The first day Cecelia helped me, I ended up convinced that the R (for right) and L (for left) in the pretty little charging were mislabeled. They weren't. First, I put in the earbuds in the wrong ears, and then I put them in upside down. Cecelia figured this out.

A major problem is that the left one keeps falling out of my ear. This is inconvenient because I am not supposed to reach down to the ground to pick things up, as that is the way I dislocated my hip. However, I can do fine with one earbud, as I have good hearing. At least I think so, but the AARP hearing test says I'm losing some of my hearing in one ear. As I have lived in apartments and condos with shared walls for the last 51 years, I am not upset at losing some hearing. Anyway, hearing is one thing and understanding is another. I can only understand American English. Since I like to watch British mysteries, I use CC...Closed Captioning. If they are British, they can be in British English, Scottish, Irish, all of which have different accents, or from Yorkshire, Shetland, Cornwall, Northumberland, Australia, or New Zealand. In other words, I can't understand half of it.

The next task is getting the earbuds paired to the computer, and then perhaps segueing to my Fitbit. Watch this space!
