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President's Letter



It is hard to believe our 40th Anniversary Year has come to an end. Not only has it been my honor to serve as President, but I have truly enjoyed my time in this position because it has allowed me the opportunity to develop new friendships and have deeper fellowships with long-time friends. It has been great fun sharing experiences with you this year. A heartfelt thank you goes to my Board for doing an outstanding job in their assignments. I am also grateful for so many Women's Council members and volunteers who have supported my efforts and the WCDABG. It has been a record-breaking year!

Because of your dedicated partnership and enthusiastic participation, we have continued our membership growth with 583 members to date under 4th VP of Membership Barbara Averitt's talented oversight; increased participation in member activities; both in attendance and financially and enjoyed the largest increase in the number of Lisianthus Society Patrons since its inception - 340 Lisianthus Patrons! Thank you to Dorothea Meltzer, our Lisianthus Society Chair, for planning a very enjoyable event for the Gold and Silver Level Lisianthus Society Patrons at Valley House in March. Thank you also to Dorothea and her committee for planning the annual Lisianthus Society Tea.

Due to the success of our fundraisers, generous donor gifts and the foresight of the Endowment Trust Committee, the Women's Council Board voted this spring to create a new Capital Garden Projects Funding Account within our Endowment Trust. We were able to contribute \$600,000 to this new account.

Thanks to our Fall events, approximately \$208,758.71 was the net from our 40th Anniversary Noble Celebration Week including A Writer's Garden and the Ruby Red Gala – under the talented, experienced leadership of AWG Chairs **Therese Rourk** and **Dyann Skelton** and RRG Chair **Sharon Ballew**, THANK YOU. You and your committees have set the bar high, exceeding budget and expectations for our 40th year celebrations! AWG was a remarkable success with a very special author **Lady Fiona Carnarvon**, the Right Honorable Countess of Carnarvon. AWG had all the bells and whistles of a Royal Regal Affair. The Ruby Red Gala was a magical, memorable, and beautifully executed evening. I could not have asked for more for our 40th Anniversary Celebration! Thank you also to **Holly** and **Phillip Huffines** for hosting our "A Noble Celebration Week" Patron Party at their exquisite home. Our very special Honorary Chairs, **Donna** and **Herb Weitzman** for AWG and **Dr. Linda Burk** and her husband **Dr. John Gilmore** for the RRG and each person on the 40th Anniversary "A Noble Celebration Week" committees deserve a big bouquet from us all!

For the 35th Annual Majestic Mad Hatter's, approximately \$ 346,000.00 was the net from our largest fundraiser of the year. This is a historical "largest ever" amount for this event, making the Majestic Mad Hatters 2023 a record-breaking success! Co-Chairs **Anne Stodghill** and **Kristina Wrenn**, our outstanding, experienced, and talented fundraising leaders brought forth their team of friends to achieve this milestone, and I am truly grateful and amazed by their achievements. Our "Celebration of English Elegance" theme offered a creative, fun, and majestic opportunity for members and patrons to support A Woman's Garden. As guests and members waltzed by the Hat Judging area, the 35th Annual Majestic Mad Hatter's bloomed with beauty on April 20th. A record-breaking number of guests were present to ENJOY a spectacular silent auction, candle sales with unique scents created for Mad Hatter's by **Lady Primrose**, a gorgeous evening gown fashion display by fashion design team and judges **Sachin & Babi**, lovely floral swings, a floral British phone booth and a floral bicycle for photo opportunities and a lovely British themed luncheon. Thank you to the gracious **Kim Hext**, the Honorary Mad Hatter's Chair who even helped arrange the MH floral centerpieces on set up day! Also, thank you to **Cindy** and **Michael Rosenthal** for opening their beautiful home and garden for the MH patron party and MH Patron Party Chair **Joni Krieg.** A very special thank you to our technical wizard, Carolyn Tobin, for her guidance and leadership as we started as new payment platform-GiveSmart.

Other income this year included Membership dues and extra dollars, Newsletter income, Donor Naming, Circle of Honor payments, Memorials Honorariums, North Texas Giving Day, the End of the Year Fiesta, Interest, Miscellaneous donations, and other income. WHICH ALL IN ALL totaled a large gross amount of \$998,467.77 flowing through our checking account. This is just shy of A MILLION DOLLARS!! After paying our operating expenses and all our A Woman's Garden expenses obligated to the Arboretum at \$324,958.59, we still netted \$673,509.18 This has been a very successful financial year for the Women's Council.

Our Long-Range Planning Committee, chaired by Kay Weeks, will continue to refine recommendations going into

the next fiscal year and beyond. The Endowment Trust and Oversight Committees and the Finance Committee have diligently helped manage our financial position and money in the Endowment Trust. Thank You for your wise fiscal management and recommendations. Each of you are the heartbeat of the Women's Council.

Like all aging gardens, extensive refurbishing and replanting becomes necessary. This has been a stellar year for A Woman's Garden as renewal, refurbishment, reimagined and revitalization projects were completed. Thank you to 8th Vice Presidents **Pier Burgess** and **Sarah Andry** and Garden Ambassador **Susan Banks** for their careful care in overseeing A Woman's Garden.

What a wonderful year full of activities we have had! You have been a membership group like no other with your participation. From last May's very first function, the "A Noble Celebration Week" Announcement Downton Abbey Movie Watching Party with the video message from Lady Carnarvon to today's event—it has been a year beyond my wildest dreams.
