

Significant Year For GHHS Legacy Society Scholarship Growth

2024 was a remarkable year for

both new and existing Legacy

Society scholarships, highlight-

ed by a contribution of \$100,000

from the family of Patricia Sharp Brown '47. Shortly after Pat's passing, her husband, Andy, initiated a Charitable Remainder Trust to benefit the GHHSAA Legacy Society. This type of trust is an excellent tool to pass funds on to charitable groups without tax consequences to the donor or the recipient. Andy's hope was that the fund would grow to \$100,000 in value prior to his own passing. Getting to know Andy better through our phone conversations over the last few years was very special. We were informed by Andy and Pat's daughter, Sandy McBride, of Andy's passing a couple of months ago. The trust funds were transferred to us in November. Sandy was aware of her father's goal and transferred additional funds in order to meet the \$100,000 goal. Going forward, a \$5,000 annual scholarship will be awarded in the name of Patricia Sharp Brown. We are incredibly grateful to the Brown family for their caring and support.

Another new scholarship, the Bob "Nero" McNabb '45 Brotherhood of Rooks scholarship, will be offered in 2025. In his will, Bob donated \$25,000 to the Legacy Society. He was a longtime supporter of Grandview and made many contributions to the school system and the GHHSAA in his lifetime.

Additional funds were also contributed this year to increase the award amounts for the Charles '63 and Barbara McKinnon Handel '65 scholarship, and by Ron Harris '56 for the Jane Hess Harris scholarship. The longterm support provided by these people is invaluable.

2025 is also off to an excellent start with the establishment of two new Legacy Society scholarships. Lillian Lathouse Smith '55 finalized a scholarship to award students who plan to study in the creative arts fields such as music, dance, art and writing.

Rose Kegler Hallern '71 and her husband, Stephen established a scholarship that will be awarded to an outstanding student with an established financial need.

These new scholarships increase the number of Legacy Society scholarships to 11 from none a few years ago. The GHHSAA and the Brotherhood of Rooks will award seven additional scholarships at the awards ceremony in April, bringing the total to eighteen.

We're grateful for the generosity of our alumni. Helping to provide educational funds for GHHS graduates remains one of the primary goals of the GHHSAA. Thanks to all for their contributions toward that goal.

Honoring Sgt. Pat Short '42

From the Final Salute book of the Grandview Heights/Marble Cliff Historical Society



Of the 62 Grandview Heights/ Marble Cliff residents in the armed forces killed in the line of duty, Sergeant Pat Short was the most decorated service member, having received both the Silver Star and the Bronze Star for Valor.

Drafted on May 15, 1943, Pat entered the Army Specialized Training Program (ASTP) at Ball State University. The ASTP was established to meet the wartime need for junior officers. Because this demand tapered off in early 1944, Pat and his fellow students were released early from the program and promoted to the rank of sergeant. Pat was sent to Europe and assigned to Company C, 407th Infantry Regiment, 102nd Infantry Division.

On Nov. 8, Sergeant Short's nighttime reconnaissance patrol inadvertently detonated some anti-personnel mines, alerting German defenders. As Pat and his patrol moved past a hidden German bunker, the enemy opened fire, wounding nine soldiers. Disregarding his safety

while under fire, Pat assisted in the evacuation of his men.

On Nov. 24, the 102nd Infantry Division began a major assault toward the Roer River. Pat was killed in action on Nov. 29, 1944, near Flossdorf, Germany. His parents were notified of his death on Dec. 29.

For his actions in rescuing his men on Nov. 8, Pat was posthumously awarded the Silver Star and later the Bronze Star for Valor for his actions at the Roer River. For more information about that operation, visit https://warfarehistorynetwork. com/article/operation-grenaderace-to-the-roer/

Grandview athletics is a mainstay in the community and has supported some of the most talented athletes ever to compete on any level. Congratulations to our 2025 inductees in the Grandview Heights High **School Sports** Hall of Fame!



Kathy Kinnard. **Faculty**

Kathy Kinnard, a former teacher, coach, and athletic director, served the Grandview community for 35 years.

Kathy came to Grandview in 1976 and was the high school's business teacher for 18 years. During that time, she coached many teams, including the junior varsity girls' basketball team in 1976. She was an assistant coach for the girls' tennis team from 1977-1981 and later took over the program as head coach from 1982-1987. She would later serve as the boys' tennis team head coach from 1986-1988.

In 1994, Kathy was named athletic director for grades 7-12 and oversaw an athletic program of 18 sports. She held this position until her retirement in 2011. From 2012 to 2021, she returned to coaching at Grandview with both the boys' and girls' tennis

During her tenure at GHHS, Kathy was chosen as the district's Teacher of the Year in 1994 and was inducted into the Ohio High School Athletic Administrators Hall of Fame in 2015.

Kathy earned her bachelor's degree from Miami University, where she played varsity tennis. She completed her master's degree at The Ohio State University. She has competed in local, regional and national **United States Tennis Association** leagues and tournaments. She continues to teach tennis locally during the summer and indoor

Kathy and her husband Alan have two daughters, Kelsey and Kiley, who are both GHHS alumni.

Teri Antolino Williams '74

Teri Antolino Williams was a four-year member of the Girls Athletic Association, serving as president her senior year. She earned point awards all four years while participating in field hockey, volleyball, basketball and track.

Teri played basketball for two years and contributed to the team that won the Metro League championship her senior year.

In track, Teri won the long jump at the AAU State Track Meet in eighth grade. In high school, she set records in the high jump and seventy-yard hurdles. Her high jump record was broken 21 years later by an athlete she would later coach. She was captain of the girls' track team in her senior year. After graduating from Grandview, she was a member of The Ohio State University track team and participated in intramural sports.

Continuing her passion for Grandview sports, Teri coached GHHS track and swim teams and also managed the Grandview Pool for several years.

Teri serves on the Grandview Heights/Marble Cliff Education Foundation Board and is also

vice president of the Grandview Alumni Association.

Married to Brad Williams '73, they have two daughters, Amy '00 and Mary '04.



Kelsey Kinnard Hessler '07

Kelsey Kinnard Hessler was a four-year varsity letter winner and scholar athlete for the girls' tennis team.

Kelsey compiled a 99-21 career match record, all at the #1 singles position. Throughout her career, she achieved significant individual accomplishments, including Team MVP (2003-2006), 1st Team All-Mid State League (2003-2006), Division II Sectional Champion (2003, 2005), fourtime Division II District Qualifier, two-time State Qualifier (2005, 2006), and 2nd Team All-Ohio (2006).

Outside of athletics, Kelsey participated in several clubs/activities, including marching band, student council, class president, French Club, Outdoor Education and National Honor Society.

After graduation, Kelsey continued her tennis career at Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio, where she was a four-year starter. She played #1 doubles

and #3-6 singles for the Musketeers, and her career match record was 97-96. She earned the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll and Intercollegiate Tennis Association Scholar-Athlete awards from 2008-2011. She graduated in 2011 with a bachelor's degree in Finance and International Business.

Following college, Kelsey continued to play in competitive tournaments and in leagues through the United States Tennis Association. One of her most memorable accomplishments was winning a Bronze Ball at the National Mother-Daughter Indoor Championships alongside Kathy Kinnard, a fellow GHHS Sports Hall of Fame member.

Kelsey resides outside of Nashville, Tenn., with her husband Jason, and their children Benjamin and Caleb.

Hilary Ells earned 12 varsity letters as a four-sport athlete, competing in soccer, swimming and diving, basketball, and track and field.


Despite missing her senior soccer and basketball season due to an ACL tear, Hilary set season and career goal-scoring records during her three seasons playing for the Bobcat soccer team. She was the leading scorer all three seasons and was voted co-captain and Offensive MVP in her sophomore and junior seasons. She earned the Agonis Club High School Athlete of the Week, and 3rd team All-District as a freshman, the College Bound Athlete and 1st team All-District as a sophomore, and the Columbus Dispatch Athlete of the Week, 1st team All-District, and 2nd team All-State as a

In track and field, Hilary was named Mid-State League runner of the year as a sophomore. As a junior, she participated on both the 4X200 meter and 4X400 meter relay teams, which set school records while qualifying for the state track meet. As a senior, she was a part of the 4X800 meter relay team that set another school record while qualifying for the state track meet once again, where the team placed

Hilary continued her education and soccer career at Capital University, where she was a four-year starter. As a sophomore, she was voted 2nd team All-Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC), and her team made it to the NCAA Division III tournament. As a senior, she scored four goals in a game, which tied a school record. Her team dominated as regular season OAC Conference and Tournament champions and qualified as a NCAA Division III Final Four participant. As a senior, she was voted OAC Forward of the Year, 1st Team All Ohio OAC, All-Ohio (OCSA, All-Region (NSCAA), and a 3rd Team All-American.

Distinguished Alumni

John F. Kaumeyer, '67 and Distinguished Alumni '09



John F. Kaumeyer '67 was a top scientist in the fields of molecular biology and genetics.

After graduating from GHHS, John spent two years in the U.S. Marine Corps, serving in Vietnam. He received a B.S. in biology from The Ohio State University, a Ph.D. in genetics from Indiana University and completed five years of postdoctoral research in molecular biology at Johns Hopkins University and the University of Pennsylvania.

He moved to California in 1987 to work for Genentech, the firm considered the founder of the biotechnology industry, where he was responsible for relationships with outside university investigators to test recombinant proteins for potential clinical indications. Recombinant proteins are proteins artificially produced in a laboratory using genetic engineering techniques and play a significant role in biomedical biotechnology, being used in research and as drugs in the treatment of various diseases.

In 1989, John began working for Lockheed Martin, an American defense and aerospace manufacturer, at the NASA Ames Research Center. NASA's Ames Research Center is one of ten NASA field centers, which provide leadership and execute NASA's work in world-class research and development in aeronautics, exploration technology and science.

At NASA, John served as the science manager on Lockheed's contracts with NASA for the Astrobiology and Space Research Programs and Projects, the Engineering and Technical Support and the Flight Payload Integration. The programs were responsible for developing science requirements for space station life science research equipment, providing operation support for flight experiments, conducting life sciences research and life support technology development in support of the space station and shuttle programs. As senior

manager on various contracts, John led a team of approximately 100 scientists, engineers and administrative staff that supported a number of technical areas, including the NASA Astrobiology Institute, the space station biological research project, flight payload integration, gravitational biology research, and astrobiology technology.

The following is from the NASA Astrogram - Communication for the Information Technology Age, December 2004 Issue:

"Kaumeyer was a respected member of the science community and had more than 25 years of experience in life sciences project management, new technology identification and transfer, scientific and laboratory research, and development and evaluation of flight- and ground-based hardware systems."

John met his wife, Joanne, on a Sierra Club backpacking trip in 1990 and they were married in 1992. With a special love for the outdoors, they enjoyed backpacking, hiking, camping, cross-country skiing and snow camping. As a wonderful stepfather, John was highly supportive of Eric and Sheila. He served as scoutmaster of Eric's Boy Scout troop for three years and never missed one of Sheila's musical performances.
