




GHHS WANTS YOU!

Broadview School

Grandview Heights Marble Cliff Historical Society



This circa 1950 photograph shows the Broadview School (aka Fifth Avenue School) at the southwest corner of Broadview and West Fifth Avenues. The original brick building had four classrooms. The adjacent single-story annex, which was added at a later date, had two classrooms.

It has been reported that the school was erected in 1898, however, a recent review of the meeting minutes of the Board of Education of the Village of Marble Cliff indicates that the board voted to buy the property and erect a school building on Oct. 25, 1905. A \$4,343 contract

was awarded to J.A. Bickerton to build a four-room school on the property.

The Grandview Heights School District, which was chartered in 1906, saw its enrollment of students grow steadily, while the Marble Cliff School District faced political turmoil and a steady decline in student enrollment.

By July 1916, the Franklin County Board of Education dissolved the Marble Cliff Board of Education and ordered all the contents of the school to be transferred to the Grandview Heights School District. By

the 1917-1918 school year, enrollment was so large in Grandview that students in grades 1-3 of were housed at the Broadview School. The school subsequently became part of the Columbus City School District which operated the building as a primary school until 1962 when the building was converted into the CCS School of Practical Nursing. The Broadview School property was sold to the Fifth Avenue Development Company in 1974 and, by 1976, a Friendly's ice cream store replaced the original school building and its two-classroom annex. Several different businesses have

occupied the site during the past 47 years.

If you attended The Broadview School the Historical Society is interested in learning about your experience there.

Brotherhood of Rooks Cabin

Around 1910, the Bronson Family purchased an old log cabin located near West Fifth Avenue and Cambridge Boulevard. They had it dismantled and reassembled on their property and it became a magnet for the young Bronson sons and their friends. The elder son, Hiram formed a GOK Club (God Only Knows) with his friends. It was limited to the original members only and ended at graduation.

His younger brother Joe Bronson '19 and best friend Marny Hendershott '19 had a better idea for fraternal spirit with better objectives and fine leadership that could live forever. The

Charter members of the Rooks were Joe Bronson '19, Al Bradbury '16, Marny Hendershott '19, Francis Paddock '17, Bob Page '17 and Ellis Rogers '18 with the first two pledges (Skunks) Bradley Skeele '19 and Lyman Markel '17. Advisors and honorary members were GHHS Principal Pearl A. McCarty and Ira Stanton Jones, a teacher and coach.

The Rooks were organized as a Christian, moral boys club with each meeting starting with a ritual and a prayer. During the early years, the cabin was their clubhouse where evenings were spent sitting around the fire laughing, smoking, joking,



discussing the Great War and who they planned to rush next. In 1920, Joe Bronson's father died and their home and the Cabin were sold. The new owner did not want the Rooks to continue meeting in the cabin.





Two unidentified fraternity brothers relax inside the Brotherhood of the Rooks cabin. The cabin was the home of the Garrett Miller family and was originally located near Cambridge Boulevard and Cardigan Road. It was moved, log by log, and reconstructed at its current location on Wyandotte Road, where it became the Rooks clubhouse. The Rooks was a high school fraternity from its inception in 1915 until such organizations were banned in Ohio in 1960. The Rooks used the 18'x20' cabin as a clubhouse until 1920, when the Bronson family, whose son Joe was a Rook, moved and the boys lost the use of the cabin. 

Seeking Distinguished Alumni Nominations

Committee members vote by secret ballot to either recommend or not recommend the nominees who meet the selection criteria. Then, the committee recommends the nominees that receive two-thirds of the votes to the GHHSAA Board of Trustees, for ratification as Distinguished Alumni.
