

The addition of the basketball program was the story of two seasons.

The Bobcats competed in the old CBL league with most schools being three to four times larger in enrollment. Bexley at two and a half times the size of Grandview was the next smallest. Other league members were Delaware, Mt. Vernon, Urbana, Whitehall, Worthington and Upper Arlington. The Cats were competitive but entered the post-season tournament with a 7-11 record. One loss was to 1963 Regional finalist Portsmouth with two athletes, Al Oliver and Larry Hisle, going on to Hall of Fame baseball careers. Two other starters would get Division 1 scholarships for basketball. The postseason saw Grandview get on a roll and defeat secondseeded Watterson, Mifflin, Aquinas and Central to advance to the district semifinals at a sold-out Fairgrounds colosseum. There were only two divisions back then - "large" and "small" - and the Bobcats found themselves five boys over the cut-off for the "small" school division. GHS was

matched with Columbus South who would win the State Tournament in 1965 with a roster intact. The other bracket featured Grove City and Newark. The Cats put up a game fight and the score was knotted at 40 after three quarters, only to eventually lose 60-50.

Grandview Heights High School Senior Class Composites

Beginning with the Class of 1922, a framed composite of photos of all graduating seniors was made and hung throughout GHHS. Over the years, many composites were stored away, and unfortunately, some disappeared. Approximately 15 years



work with the school's Key Club to get these

important parts of the high school's history restored to their original state and hung in the hallways of the school where they belonged. The extensive project attracted the attention of several community groups, including the GHHSAA and the Historical Society. The GHH-SAA put out a call to members to try to locate some of the missing ones. The Historical Society offered to help with re-matting and framing the existing composites. GHHS senior Taylor Pickering volunteered to create composites for the classes preceding 1922, and for any classes for which a composite couldn't be located. GHHS Industrial Technology teacher Brad Gintert and his students helped make frames for each composite. Community residents also volunteered to help with framing and hanging them in the hallways of the high school. The old and recreated class composites were rehung in the high school and officially rededicated during a "Celebrating Our Schools" ceremony held Oct. 3, 2010.

During the recent renovation of the high school, all class composites were digitized. Under the direction of a faculty and

administration committee, all the digitized class composites were printed, fitted with new matching frames and rehung in their rightful place throughout the newly renovated high school. They are currently displayed against a Bobcat Bluepainted background with the lyrics to the GHHS Alma Mater printed below. Work continues to fill in missing composites. The couple increased their original gift to include the purchase of more instruments so more students could play. "So many doors open to students through music," said Wyman. "As a musicivvan, I know that when a student finds joy and success in music class, it leads to better attendance, engagement, and success in school."




