

A LOOK AT TONIGHT'S TEAMS:

CONSOLATION ROUND

SAINT MATTHEW

With eight players returning from Joe Ritvalsky's 26-9 team of last year, Saint Matthew's quickly established themselves as one of the top teams in the city.

In League Play, Saint Matthew's boasts an unblemished 19-0 mark that includes a 57-34 decision over Saint Martin's, the defeading Archdiocesean champion, two wins over last year's La Salle Tournament Champion Saint Bart's.

Saint Matthew was preping for their regional championship game against Saint Tim's as this program went to press.

The Mayfair team was the runner-up in the Textile Christmas Tournament losing the finals to neighborhood rival Saint Tim's who they defeated to reach last Sunday's semi-finals.

Saint Matt's only other loses were to Wagner Junior High the defending Public League Champion and to Holy Child in an overtime thriller here last week.

Led by Bob Convey (17 ppg), starting in his third straight La Salle Tournament Saint Matt's has it's strongest backcourt in years. John Dornisch (9 ppg) rounds out the guard posts. The other starters are Mike Rauchut (8 ppg), Steve Hekierski (8 ppg) and John Rauchut (11 ppg).

Saint Matt's will play Saint John of the Cross in tonight's consolation opener at 7 P.M.

SAINT JOHN OF THE CROSS

Opening the season on December 2nd of last year, Saint John's played their first game without their coaches Dan and Mike Carr. Mike was getting married and Dan was his best man. With Jim Kenny at the helm St. John's defeated Queen of Peace by two points.

The next six games would see St. Johns dominate their opponents, led by the unselfsih playmaking of Rodeny Basketbill, Saint John's was on their way to one of their best season's ever.

The first loss came to Saint Philip Neri's, and the defeat was repeated in the league's championship game. St. John's ended the season with a 15-3 overall record including a 10-1 mark.

Leading the team are Rodney Basketbill (18ppg), Tom Kenny (10ppg), Tom Walsh (10ppg), Joe Henry (16ppg) and defensive ace Jim Matysik (3ppg).

Saint John's will face Saint Matthew's in tonight's first game.
