THE MULTI-FAMILY FOUNDATION

Scholarship Guidelines and Applicant Instructions

I. General Overview

The Multi-Family Foundation (The Foundation) will award up to (4) \$800.00 cash scholarships to qualified MFF family members and (1) MFF reunion host city community member* applicants enrolled in college or accepted to attend an institution of higher learning with the intent of pursuing an Associate degree or higher. All scholarship awards for future years will be contingent upon available funding.

II. Criteria for Scholarship Awards *Non-Family: Must be a community member of reunion host city.

HIGH SCHOOL APPLICANT

Persons to be considered for awards under this category must meet the following criteria.

- 1. Must have or in the process of obtaining a High School Diploma or Equivalent.
- 2. Must be a legal citizen of the United States of America or one of its Territories.
- 3. Must have a minimum cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 through the third (3rd) quarter of the current school term and submit a school transcript.
- 4. Must be accepted or enrolled in an accredited College/University with the intent of pursuing an Associate degree or higher.
- 5. Must submit a typed, double-spaced 300 500 word essay. This year's topic is:
 - Contributions African Americans Have Made to Our Society
- 6. Must provide (2) letters of recommendation, (1) from each of the following categories:
 - a. Either a Faculty Member, Teacher or Guidance Counselor
 - b. Community Member(Non-Family, Clergy member (Non-Family)
- 7. Submit the completed application package to the Scholarship Committee, 5298 Bell Avenue, Jurupa Valley, CA 92509 (postmarked no later than June 30) or by email to the Scholarship Committee email address: scholarship@multifamilyfoundation.org no later than 11:50 PM on June 30.

COLLEGE APPLICANT

Persons to be considered for awards under this category must meet the following criteria.

- 1. Must be a legal citizen of the United States of America or one of its Territories.
- 2. Must be currently enrolled and in good standing at a United States of America accredited College/University with the intent of pursuing an Associate degree or higher.
- 3. Must have a minimum cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 through the third (3rd) quarter of the current school term and submit an (unofficial) school transcript.
- 4. Must provide (1) letter of recommendation from any one of the following categories:
 - a. Faculty Advisor or Department Head or Professor
 - b. Employer, Clergy Member (Non-Family)
