## **Vicious Animal**

#### 1. PURPOSE

This policy provides strict requirements for the control of vicious animals, ensuring the safety and peace of our community.

#### 2. PERSONS AFFECTED

Property owners, residents, Board members, officers, and employees of the Association.

#### 4. DEFINITIONS

- 4.1. Vicious Animal: Any animal that, when unprovoked, approaches any person in a vicious or terrorizing manner, bites, inflicts injury upon, assaults, or otherwise attacks a person or domestic animal without provocation anywhere other than in the owner's house or inside an owner's fenced yard.
- 4.2. CCC: Standards Committee Chairperson (or designee)

# 5. POLICY

- 5.1. Ownership or possession of a vicious animal, as defined within the subdivision, is prohibited.
- 5.2. Members reporting a vicious animal must make a report to the appropriate public agency in addition to the Board.
- 5.3. The Board shall have the right to compel the immediate confinement or removal of a suspected vicious animal from the subdivision at the owner's expense until the Board can verify an assertion of a vicious animal.
- 5.4. In addition to imposing fines, the Board shall have the right to compel the permanent removal of a confirmed vicious animal from the subdivision.
- 5.5. Fines for vicious animal violations can be assessed retroactively to the date an owner or occupant is notified in writing that they are suspected of possessing a vicious animal.

#### 6. RESPONSIBILITIES

6.1. Owners/occupants are responsible for immediately removing a vicious animal, as

defined, from the subdivision.

- 6.2. Members reporting a vicious animal are responsible for reporting to the appropriate public agency before notifying the Board.
- 6.3. The CCC is responsible for taking appropriate action to enforce Board policy regarding reported vicious animal complaints.

## 7. PROCEDURES

- 7.1. The CCC shall investigate and initiate enforcement actions, when necessary, consistent with Board policy. This includes conducting interviews, gathering evidence, and issuing warnings and notifications as appropriate.
- 7.2. The CCC is also responsible for documenting and reporting all enforcement actions to the Board.
- 7.3. When, in the opinion of the CCC, evidence supports a report of a suspected vicious animal, they shall immediately verbally order the owner of the animal, if possible, and in writing, that the owner confine or remove the animal from the subdivision while a final determination is concluded.
- 7.4. The custodian of records shall retain all notes, photographs, and documents regarding the enforcement reports in the appropriate property file.
