

Ralph Bergdoll, of Miamisburg, OH died November 17, 2023 at age 87 in Dayton, Ohio. Ralph was a beloved son, husband, brother, uncle, and long time track coach, and will be greatly missed. He was born on May 31,1936 and spent his youth in Paw Paw, West Virginia. He graduated from West Virginia Wesleyan University in 1957 and began teaching and coaching. He coached track and field and cross county in Miamisburg from 1958 to 1987. His teams won 153 track and 290 cross country meets during his long tenure. Overall he coached over 100 seasons, combining fall and spring seasons, and was inducted into the Ohio Track and Field Hall of Fame in 1989. He loved his sport and returned to coaching at Wittenberg University and ran a regional recruiting site for many years in his retirement. He also had the honor of serving as an official for the United States of America Track and Field organization. We will also remember him for being an avid Civil War scholar and enthusiast. He was a regular presenter at the Southwest Ohio Civil War Club. He was preceded in death by his parents, Clarence and Ethyl Bergdoll, his dear wife, Zona "Gail" Bergdoll, his brother Wayne Bergdoll of Gallipolis, OH, and niece Elizabeth "Betsy" Bergdoll. Helen Reed was named Miamisburg Citizen of the Year Monday night at a banquet held at Alex's Continental Inn. The Miamisburg Business Association, which sponsors the award, cited Miss Reed for her



long-time community activities which began in 1936 when she became an English teacher in the Miamisburg school system.

MOST RECENTLY, she joined the Miami Valley Literacy Council which assists adults in learning to read. Miss Helen Reed became a private tutor for the council which concentrates on helping foreign adults improve their reading abilities and she still works for the Miamisburg Literacy Council by helping to keep

enough volunteer tutors in the program to keep up with the over-riding demand for their services.

During the early years of her teaching career, she saw the need for a library in the high school and helped institute one. She became a part-time librarian and eventually became the first full-time librarian in the system.

She retired in 1973, but remained active in the community. She was member of the group which eventually succeeded in merging the Miamisburg Library with the Dayton-Montgomery County Library System and has recently completed her tenure as chairwoman of the task force responsible for the building of the new library now under construction in the city's Library Park.
