


GIVING HONOR TO WHOM HONOR IS DUE

MHS Class of 1964 Sponsors Military Banner to Recognize Mark V. Dennis



Mark V. Dennis graduated from high school in 1964. He was the first young man from Miamisburg to die in Vietnam. Mark, a Navy medic, was killed on July 15, 1966; but his family held out hope for decades the Miamisburg man was alive. He was a Hospitalman, 3rd Class with the U.S. Navy, assigned as a medic to Echo Company with the Marines in Dong Ha. He was also the acting chaplain for his unit and wanted to be a missionary. He died when his helicopter was shot down.

Fifty-one years later--April 6, 2017, he was inurned in Hillgrove Cemetery. The Rev. Mike Tuttle officiated. The Military Order of the Purple Heart Chapter 31, American Legion Post 165, VFW Post 3438 and Ohio Patriot Guard Riders participated in the memorial service. **See**: Photo Album *Memorial for Mark V.
