# **Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

"Woe is me, I am doomed!" "I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle." "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Do you notice a theme today? Each of these lines – taken from our readings – reveals the humbling reality that when human beings stand before the glorious presence of God, we must confront the Truth by looking at ourselves honestly and in recognizing our sinfullness. We are reminded of the Garden of Eden, when original sin disfigured human nature and Adam and Eve, in realizing their nakedness, hid themselves from God. The story would be tragic if that had been the end. But in today's readings and in our own lives, the crippling effects of our sin are *not* the end. By becoming aware of our sin – agonizing though this may be – we invite the Lord in. It's the crack in the door by which He will enter, bringing mercy and freedom found only in Him. Each of today's readings shows how God's presence leads us to acknowledge our neediness; however, that's only "step one." Notice what happens next in each instance. "Your wickedness is removed, your sin purged." "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective." "Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid." See how, in each example, hearts are transformed from shame and guilt to courage and confidence. The readings explain how as each person is freed, he is compelled to act boldly. So, what changed? The same thing which can happen in our own lives: as we acknowledge our sin, we open ourselves to the flow of grace. We allow the Lord to heal and free us, making us radiant and setting our hearts on fire with love. Choose one virtue which you'd like to cultivate in order to root out a sinful habit. Then make a plan to practice that virtue. It can be as simple as "I will always pray to the Holy Spirit before I talk to that person at work who bothers me." Make sure your plan is: (1) specific ["I will never sin again" doesn't count], and (2) doable ["I will pray every day for six hours to grow in patience" is not possible for most people]. Finally, offer your plan to God and ask him for whatever strength, grace, and healing which you need to grow in that virtue.



# What is the Shroud of Turin?

The Shroud of Turin is a linen cloth bearing the faint image of a man who appears to have been crucified. It is believed by many to be the burial shroud of Jesus Christ. The origins of the Shroud remain a mystery, with its first confirmed historical appearance in the 14th century in Lirey, France. It later came into the possession of the House of Savoy in the 15th century and was eventually moved to Turin, Italy, in 1578, where it remains today.Scientific investigations have produced conflicting results. A 1988 radiocarbon dating test suggested the cloth dates to the Middle Ages (between 1260 and 1390), but critics argue the sample may have been contaminated or taken from a later repair. Other studies, including pollen analysis and textile comparisons, suggest the fabric may be much older. The image itself has not been conclusively explained, with some researchers proposing it was formed by an unknown process related to radiation or natural chemical reactions. The Catholic Church does not formally declare the Shroud to be authentic but allows veneration as a representation of Christ's Passion and Death. It has been publicly displayed only occasionally, attracting millions of pilgrims. Debate over its authenticity continues, making it one of the most studied and controversial relics in history.
